

Ornamental Plants and Flowers of Tropical Mexico

Dr. Linda Abbott Trapp, author of Ornamental Plants and Flowers of Tropical Mexico, will talk about the process of researching and writing.

Although the plants and flowers commonly seen by tourists in Mexico also grow in other subtropical climates, no book on the topic had been published specific to the plants of Mexico.



Her research coincided with the development of the Botanical Gardens of Puerto Vallarta, which provided a head start on the identification process. A number of these plants grow seasonally in northern climates or can be grown as houseplants. Linda will also introduce two additional books she wrote in Mexico and will open discussion about tropical

plants, research, and writing, as well as the joys and trials of pursuing a project such as this in another culture.

Dr. Trapp recently returned to California after 5½ years in Puerto Vallarta. A former Dean at the California School of Professional Psychology and owner of the consulting firm Abbott & Associates, Linda is an internationally known speaker who has authored seven books and more than 250 articles, columns, and reviews.
